Over the year, Skills Launch participants will enjoy a blend of experiential learning (classroom and virtual) and workplace experience, that explores diverse economic sectors and opportunities in New Brunswick. While in the program you will:

- Learn about various occupations, employment skills, and Canadian workplace culture.
- Participate in Workplace Health and Safety Training and get a certificate.
- Attend a 16-week in-class training with living expenses.
- Complete a 26-week paid work experience/internship.

This program can help you:

- Increase your confidence in your skills and abilities.
- Help you discover your potential and become more independent.
- Potentially offer a full-time employment opportunity

## PARTICIPANTS MUST:

- ✓ Be between the ages of 18 to 30 years old and not attending school
- ✓ Be committed to complete the classes, technical training, and employment workshops
- ✓ Be available and committed to complete 26 weeks of paid employment
- ✓ Have CLB level 4 completed
